Colinsburgh Town Hall Vision Statement

Colinsburgh Town Hall, built in 1894, owned by Colinsburgh and managed by the Colinsburgh Community Trust Charity provides a facility for a large number of community projects, services, and events. The building, whilst essentially sound following a number of upgrade works funded by successful grant applications and fund-raising, still requires **renovation across a number of areas** to ensure it remains a usable, safe, and comfortable environment for the foreseeable future. **Storage facilities are stretched,** and the potential loss of the Galloway Library will mean a number of community organisations who use it will need to relocate to the Town Hall, **putting extra pressure on the current space available**. The Town Hall is also **not very energy efficient**: it is **poorly insulated** and uses **expensive wall-mounted electrical heaters**. There is practically **no parking** available on the site and **nowhere to store bikes**.

In the future, following the delivery of the <u>Colinsburgh Town Hall Improvement Strategy</u> funded by successful *grant applications from a wide range of providers*, the Town Hall will be fit for purpose and fit for use. It will have had *all essential maintenance work* carried out on the internal and external fabric of the building to ensure that the Hall environment is safe, dry, and weather tight. The outstanding work on the *large window* will have been completed. All internal *fixtures and fittings will be serviceable and operational* or have been replaced. The hall will have been *rewired*. A fast *Wi-Fi* connection will be in place. All internal spaces will be *redecorated* where required, and the *main wooden floor and entrance lobby tiling renovated*. *Extra parking* will be provided, including access to *charging points for EVs*. All these works will have been *scheduled to minimise the impact* on activities. A *maintenance schedule* will be prepared and kept up to date to help plan future grant applications to fund the work. *Additional storage/activities space* will be enabled or provided which will also ensure that organisational activities relocated from the Galloway Library are *satisfactorily accommodated*.

An *efficient and sustainable energy generation and storage system* will be provided. *Surplus energy* will be utilised for the benefit of the Hall and local community. The current heating system will be removed and replaced with an alternative, *more efficient heating solution, professionally designed* for large, high rooms with an intermittent heating demand. Attention will be paid to *improved insulation* where this is affordable and viable This will *reduce energy-running costs* and *support the Green agenda*.

The delivery of this vision by the strategy will make Colinsburgh Town Hall a highly attractive, usable, and desirable facility, both for existing organisations and activities (and any new ones) for the foreseeable future.
