## Rules & Regulations

1. Admission to Show - £2
2. All articles of competition must have been in the possession of the exhibitor for at least sixty days before the day of the show.
3. No competitor allowed to stage more than two exhibits in any class with articles of the same denomination.
4. Completed entry forms should be in the Association's hands by 9am on the Saturday of the Show.
5. Each article must be accompanied by a label (20p each) supplied by the Association, with the competitor's name and address written therein along with the number in the Schedule and the Section to which it belongs. The label should be securely attached to the article, otherwise it cannot be received.
6. When one article is entered for competition the judges may award a prize. They may also withhold prizes for articles of insufficient merit. The judges' decision is final.
7. Hall will be open from 6pm until 9pm on Friday prior to Show. All competitors and exhibitors must have their exhibits in by 9.30am on the morning of the Show. (Hall open 8am.) The exhibits will be arranged by the Show Manager and a committee.
8. All cut flowers must be shown in Association vases which will be supplied.
9. Exhibits in all classes marked with an asterisk must be put on stands instead of in vases.
10. The committee reserve the power to deal with any case that may arise. All protests must be lodged with the Association not later than 3.00pm on the day of the Show, otherwise they cannot be entertained.
11. No competitor or exhibitor will be allowed to remove any exhibit until 4pm.
12. It must be understood that the prize money will be paid wholly or in such proportion as the income of the year will allow.
13. Prize money will be paid on the Show Day up to 4.30pm.
14. The Association will not be responsible for the loss of or damage done to plants, flowers, vegetables, fruits, stands or other articles while in the exhibition. All ordinary care will be taken.
15. All winners of cups must return same in good order to the Association on or before 1st August each year.
16. Where cups, medals or special prizes of any kind are awarded on a points system, the basis of each case will be:
  - 1st PRIZE      3 POINTS
  - 2nd PRIZE      2 POINTS
  - 3rd PRIZE      1 POINT
